St. Paul's University Chancellor, Hon. Prof. Margaret Kobia, PhD, EGH, held an early morning briefing meeting with the university's leadership on 19th May 2025, led by the VC Rev. Canon Prof. James Kombo, to review the progress of the institution's upcoming Strategic Plan (2025–2030).

During the session, Dr. Stanley Karanja, the lead consultant from Stan Consulting Group, presented the current draft of the Strategic Plan to the Chancellor for feedback and input.

The engagement aimed to ensure alignment with the university's vision and mission as the final stages of the strategic planning process are undertaken.

Prof. Kobia emphasized the importance of strategic foresight and inclusive planning in guiding the university's next chapter of growth, innovation, and academic excellence.

The Strategic Plan (2025–2030) is expected to serve as a guiding framework for institutional development, research advancement, global engagement, and student-centered transformation at St. Paul's University.

L. Paul's University welcomed a new force at the helm of its financial and administrative engine: Dr. Mwirigi Kiula. The Vice Chancellor, Rev. Canon Prof. James Kombo, alongside senior university leadership, officially ushered in Dr. Kiula as the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Finance and Administration (DVC-FA) on Tuesday, June 3, 2025. This appointment is a strategic move to deepen the university's operational excellence, financial prudence, and digital innovation.

With over two decades of experience woven through academia, healthcare, research, and government partnerships, Dr. Kiula is not your typical finance executive. He is a scholar, a tech-savvy innovator, and a seasoned leader who brings a rare blend of digital transformation prowess and institutional governance to the table.

Before his appointment to St. Paul's, Dr. Kiula served as the Director of ICT & Innovation at the Kenyatta University Teaching, Referral and Research Hospital (KUTRRH), where he led a bold digital transformation agenda. From information security systems to medical innovation infrastructure, he helped modernize one of Kenya's leading health institutions, proof that his impact is felt wherever systems need

structure, vision, and change.

His track record stretches further back, with previous roles as ICT Director at Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology (JKUAT), where he played a central role in steering the university's digital journey. His public service includes project management roles under the County Government of Nandi and NACADA, with a specific focus on citizen experience transformation.

At a national level, Dr. Kiula is no stranger to governance. He serves as a Member of Council at KCA University, contributing to strategic decisions in academic, student affairs, risk management, and audit oversight. He also serves as a trustee at KUTRRH's staff retirement benefits scheme, reflecting his deep involvement in fiduciary responsibility and institutional welfare.

Beyond the titles, Dr. Kiula is a thinker and mentor. He holds a PhD in Leadership and Governance (2018), a Master of Science in ICT Policy and Regulation (2010), and a Bachelor's in Computer Science (2004) all from JKUAT. He also volunteers as a senior lecturer at SALT University College in Ghana, where his global outlook meets grassroots mentorship.
